


The paint's shifting densities reinforce the sense that we are looking through a window which holds the image and gives way to light which both illuminates and scours it.

Studies on Mylar and Glass, the ongoing series of more than 50 works that he began in 2010, falls into three categories,

- beginning with imagined landscapes, with large forms that suggest gorges, rocky topography, and stormy skies. All of these can be read as visions of the Finger Lakes area of upstate New York, the artist's home for more than 40 years.
- 2 A second group of paintings employs a graphic X that implies an existential conundrum: a bold assertion of identity that at the same time aggressively negates.
- 3 The third kind of paintings are complex works in which abstract forms start to resemble organic and geometric images in a small cosmos bounded by gray borders.









1960's 1964	USA political struggle awareness USA Civil Rights Movement, Student Nonviolent Coordinating Committee, Mississippi
1964	USA Alternative Service Program BA, English, Hamilton College, NY
1970	Advanced from Writing to Visual Art, carved figural wood sculptures and began meditation Became a self-taught professional artist with establishing his own studio near Ithaca NY
1982	Vow of Silence, sculpture with 7 month vow of personal silence Artistic vow and style of transforming violence into compassion and heal the wounds of the nuclear age
1980's	Began painting in association with sculpture Began his intuitive process to engage and trust material exploration as part of process Developed the concept of Art as an aid to healing and inner growth

	Oracle, Mirage, and Templates for Another Life, series of paintings
2003-2009	Meditation Shawls, painting portal for viewer interaction
2009	Shrouds for Children, series of shrouds for individual children that died from large, human-caused events
2010-present	Studies on Mylar and Glass, currently 50 paintings are completed in this series. Luminous, reverse-sided paintings set in transparency
