If the database doesn't offer full-text, look up the journal title in the E-Journal Portal to check other possible sources for the full-text article. You can also browse e-journals by subject.

A Note About Peer Review

Peer review refers to the policy of experts in the field examining journal articles before acceptance for publication. Peer review insures that the research described in a journal's articles is scientifically sound and of high quality. Sometimes the term "refereed" is used instead of peer-reviewed.
