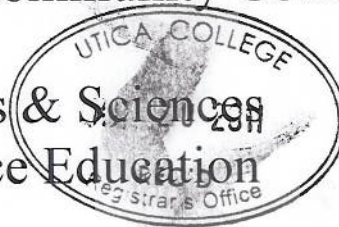

Utica College and Mohawk Valley Community College, in recognition of a mutual respect for the integrity of parallel academic programs and in an effort to better serve students intending to pursue the completion of a bachelors degree, hereby enter into an agreement of an articulated program.

OBJECTIVES:

1. To encourage the transfer of qualified students from Mohawk Valley Community College (MVCC) to Utica College.
2. To award academic credit for courses completed at MVCC, that meet the terms of the Associate Degree: Liberal Arts & Sciences: Adolescence Education program for application toward the requirements for the Adolescence Education program (Grades 7-12) at Utica College.
3. To provide effective and concise guidelines for students seeking to transfer to Utica College. Students will have accurate and clear information regarding the transfer of their coursework and credits toward the Bachelor of Arts or Bachelor of Science degree at Utica College.

TERMS OF THE TRANSFER ARTICULATION AGREEMENT:

1. Utica College guarantees the acceptance of students who completed the Associate in Science: Liberal Arts & Sciences program at MVCC with a cumulative GPA of 2.75 or better to Utica College. Transfer students who do not meet these criteria will be evaluated individually.
2. Utica College guarantees the transfer of credit as stipulated in the attached Program of Studies. This agreement assumes the completion of the Associate Degree and completion of the courses listed on the attached Program of Studies. Utica College requires that the last 30 credit hours granted toward the Bachelor degree must be earned in residence, with matriculated status. Additionally, a Bachelor of Arts degree requires that a *minimum of 90 of the 120 credits must be in the liberal arts* while the Bachelor of Science requires a *minimum of 60 of the 120 credits must be in the liberal arts*.
 - Students pursuing the Adolescence Education program must major in one of the following: Biology, Chemistry, English, History, Mathematics, Physics.
 - In addition to the requirements of the major and courses for the Adolescence Program, students must fulfill the following requirements (some of which may be satisfied by this articulation agreement): one year of college-level study in a language other than English and at least 6 credits *each* in English, Mathematics, Science and History.
 - Students must complete and appropriately document a minimum of 100 hours of fieldwork in a school setting with at least 50 of those hours in high-needs schools.
3. MVCC transfer Students will be subject to all general education requirements of Utica College as set forth in the Utica College catalogue.
 - Transfer students with a completed Associates Degree will be exempt from Components I & II of Utica College's Core Requirements.
 - Students who transfer 30 credits of liberal arts and sciences (with at least 2 courses in each of UC's three categories of Component II Core—including one lab science course) will be exempt from Component II Core.
 - Transfer Students who enter Utica College with Components I & II complete will be required to complete 3 credits of Component III: Integrated Writing.
4. This document is based upon the evaluation of course descriptions presented to Utica College. Courses listed in this agreement will transfer to Utica College provided a grade of "C" or better has been earned. Credit will be granted according to the appended list of equivalent courses or as general elective credit.
5. This Agreement shall remain in effect for a period of two years from the date listed below, with the provision that the terms specified herein will continue to apply to the students admitted from MVCC's Associate in Science: Liberal Arts & Sciences: Adolescence Education within one year of the expiration of the agreement. Each institution agrees to provide timely notice to the other in the event of any modification to the curriculum that might affect the compatibility for admission and transfer of coursework. This agreement may be subject to change, without notice, if curriculum requirements change at either institution. Students admitted to the MVCC's Associate in Science: Liberal Arts & Sciences: Adolescence Education program prior to such notification shall be admitted to Utica College on the basis of this agreement.

BENEFITS/ADVANTAGES:


1. MVCC transfer students are eligible for scholarship and financial aid in all ways the same as continuing Utica College students.
2. Utica College will provide housing in campus residence halls within the guidelines and practices governing availability of housing for continuing students.
4. MVCC transfer students are eligible to participate in internships, externships, co-ops, field placements and study abroad opportunities open to continuing Utica College students.




