Q. What makes a good production?

A. You have to start with good material, and once you have that, everyone has to work together and put their best into it. In a good production, it has to be about the production and the audience - not about you. It is all about transporting the audience and taking them on a journey and making their time worthwhile.

Q. What is something that most do not know about the theatre program at UC?

A. Because we have a theater minor and not a major, our program's students major in a wide variety of things. We have students who are ECI, pre-med, pre-law, communication majors and more. I love this because we always have a broad range of experiences to draw upon, and they always have a great attitude and are willing to try anything. Our program is far more intimate than other theatre programs and there is more input from students in all aspects of the production.

Q. What is your greatest accomplishment and challenge?

A. My greatest accomplishment was writing my book. I am a theatre historian; in theatre you are involved in many different academic and production aspects. While in college in Detroit, I worked with a children's theatre that performed in this great historic theatre. I didn't really know anything about it, but there were all of these unique drawings on the wall from the 1920s to the present.

I began to notice small details about the images - like how the chorus girls have really hairy legs. I soon learned that this theatre was home to a men's theatrical social club. I decided to do my grad school dissertation on the club, and through some contacts, I was able to access their records back to 1910. What really interested me was the type of plays that they wrote and what they said about the group and the time period that they lived in. For example, I read their plays from the '20s that talk about the "new woman" and you can see their fears and how they thought this would change their lives.

As far as my greatest challenge, everything is a challenge - and that is not necessarily a bad thing. At UC, it is making sure that we create a successful and stable program that utilizes its resources to the best of our ability and helps students grow.

Q. What surprised you about UC?

A. I always wanted to work at a small school, and I was really excited when UC called me. One thing that surprised me was the crossover, camaraderie and cooperation. I know the faculty here - and not just the ones in the theatre department. The ability to have such easy conversations with those who have very different training makes all the difference in the world.


