This highly interdisciplinary minor will explore the many linkages among the various natural sciences involved in understanding even individual environmental issues. It will also link the natural sciences and social sciences, highlighting the direct societal relevance of the health of our environment and an understanding of such while focusing strongly on social, institutional, policy, and procedural biases in decision-making with regard to environmental issues that lead to disparities in exposure to environmental harm.
