Partner universities must **nominate** students one month before the application deadlines below with the following information: Name, Date of Birth, Field of study/Major, Citizenship, Academic Average (clarify scale)

<b>Application Deadlines</b>
Semester 1 (March-July 2019): November 15, 2018
Semester 2 (August-December 2019): April 15, 2019
<b>Requirements for Exchange Students</b>
Be at least 18 years old
Be enrolled at least in the second year of undergraduate studies at the home university
3.0 GPA or more (on a 4.0 scale) and good standing at home university
Prior coursework related to intended studies at the Universidad de Montevideo
<b>Application Procedure</b>
After receiving nominations from partner universities the UM Office of International Affairs will send an online Application Form with the required documents, information, course preferences and orientation fee.
Meeting the admission requirements set out by the University does not guarantee admission to study at the UM. The University reserves the right to refuse admission to anyone, and admission decisions are deemed final.
Therefore, we recommend applicants not to buy flight tickets before receiving the acceptance letter.

Grading system	The grading scale goes from 1-12; 6 and above is a passing grade.
UM Academic Assessment	<p>One (1) UM credit is equivalent to 10 class hours.</p> <p>In order to pass and receive credit for a course, students should:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Have a minimum class attendance of 75%.</li> <li>2. Obtain a minimum grade of six (6) for the course, which includes midterm papers, oral presentations, and class participation.</li> <li>3. Pass the final examination with at least six (6).</li> </ol> <p>As UM students, international students can take final exams in 3 examination periods on site. They have to pass the exam before returning to their country within the examination period. <b>Students must check the exam dates before buying flight tickets.</b></p>
Language(s) of instruction	At UM, courses are mainly taught in Spanish. Some Schools offer courses, seminars, and programs in English, mainly in the semestre August-December.
Language requirements	<p>A <b>B2 or C1 level</b> from the Common European Framework of References for Languages (CEFR) is required to attend courses in Spanish. A <b>C1/C2 level</b> is required to take courses in the Translation and Interpretation Degree.</p> <p>Non-Spanish speaking students must take a placement Spanish test upon arrival. The UM has an agreement with International House in Montevideo which offers a discount for students from partner universities.</p> <p>Students should know basic Spanish in order to interact comfortably on a day to day basis.</p>

Housing	UM has <b>no on-campus housing</b> . Students can live in student residences or rent apartments within a range of prices. The International Affairs Office assists students with accommodation information.
Estimated cost of living (per month)	<p>Accommodation – U.S. Dollars 350 - 600</p> <p>Food – U.S. Dollars 350</p> <p>Local transportation – U.S. Dollars 120</p> <p>Books and Photocopies – U.S. Dollars 80</p> <p>We recommend students to bring an International Credit Card.</p>
Health Insurance	<p>The Universidad de Montevideo requires incoming students to have already acquired all-encompassing health insurance before arriving in Uruguay.</p> <p>For emergencies the University is affiliated with the Mobile Medical Emergency System (SEMM), which provides coverage within campus.</p>
Student Conduct Code	Possessing, using, providing, manufacturing, distributing, or selling drugs is prohibited by the Student Conduct Code. Use or possession of marijuana, including Medical Marijuana is strictly prohibited at the UM campus.
