






Thank you to all of the mentors who had to change gears in March of 2020, I honor you today.

Shoes in landfills can take 30 to 40 years to decompose.








We have built a friendship that I hope will grow beyond the mentor/mentee level: I eagerly look forward to hearing about his new opportunities and experiences.




ORIGAMI

More creativity. Holley mailed her two mentees, Vy and Truth origami paper. As you can see, they had fun and were actually very good at making origami swans.




